In the lecture, Dr Stoddart explores the notion that we are still "complicit in the male violence and misogyny that is depicted in the original version of the fairytales", and quotes from Patricia Duncker, who says that Carter "reproduces rather than alters the original, deeply and rigidly sexist pyschology' of the tales. Do you agree? Why / why not?
7. Dr Stoddart also refers to Margaret Atwood, who says that the tales "celebrate relativity and metamorphosis" and are more interested in the "link between victim and aggressor, which is not defined in terms of one gender or another necessarily." Do you agree? Why / why not?
8. Dr Stoddart also says that some critics have found "the eroticism of violence" in the stories "deeply unsettling." Do you agree? Why / why not?

## Glossary

- **Repressed** Restrained or oppressed; in psychology refers to a thought or desire that is kept suppressed and unconscious in one's mind. *e.g. Freud believed that dreams were a way of tapping into your repressed feelings.*
- **Paradigm** A pattern or model. e.g. 'The Angel in the House' is a paradigm of the 'ideal woman.'
- Latent Hidden or concealed. e.g. Underneath his casual attitude lay a latent talent.
- **Complicit** Involved with others in something that is unlawful or morally wrong. *e.g. He was complicit in the cover up of the murder.*
- **Misogyny** Dislike or hatred of women; an ingrained prejudice against women. *e.g. Feminists argue that we must do everything we can to tackle misogyny.*
